Using digital cameras, measuring tapes, surveying poles, pencil, paper and recording sheets, the first condition survey of the preserved Fishing Smack and Wash Shrimper LN89 'Activity' (1904) will commence on Saturday morning. Would you like to be onboard and join the team to explore the boat preserved at the most excellent True's Yard community museum? A day of hands on marine archaeology is on offer!

You'll be taught how to survey, take measurements interpret planks, iron fittings and ropes, so you can understand how the boat worked in its heyday. The boat is part of the museum's Silver Jubilee 25 Year Appeal, so all your observations will be put to good use to inform the future preservation of this unique part of Lynn's fishing heritage.
